<b>Basic Function of the post:</b>	<p>The Post-Doctoral Fellow will undertake sociological research on themes such as identity; social interfaces; knowledge; and learning. S/he will apply sociological theory to undertake desk-studies and field research on demonstration farms, with a particular emphasis on processes of 'knowledge brokering' in the context of agricultural extension. A key function of the role is to work collaboratively with actors in agricultural extension (advisers and specialists) and a range of other actors involved in the AgriDemo:F2F consortium. Analysis of desk-reviews, fieldwork and stakeholder interactions in social interfaces will be written up in the form of material for policy-makers and rural professionals; and journal articles. The successful candidate will be based at Teagasc's Department of Spatial Analysis &amp; Agri-Food Innovation at the Rural Economy Development Programme, Athenry. S/he will work within the communities of the AgriDemo:F2F EU Horizon 2020 project consortium involving approx. 20 partners.</p>
<b>Background:</b>	<p>The AgriDemoF2F project is an inter-disciplinary, multi-actor project that aims to generate new knowledge on how farmer-to-farmer learning may be optimised in the context of agricultural demonstration farms. The project is impact-focused and include as active agents farmers, extension officers and other rural professionals. The AgriDemo:F2F project is coordinated by the Dairy Knowledge Transfer Department at Teagasc's Animal & Grassland Research and Innovation Centre, Moorepark, leading the knowledge exchange component of the project. The social science research component of the project is led by the Department of Spatial Analysis and Agri-Food Innovation at Teagasc's Rural Economy and Development Programme (REDP), Athenry.

The mission of the Animal & Grassland Research and Innovation Centre, Moorepark is to generate new science and innovation to increase the efficiency and competitiveness of the Irish Agri-food industry. The mission of the Rural Economy and Development Programme (REDP) is to enhance the quality of life in rural Ireland, thus contributing to the achievement of Teagasc's key goals of Competitiveness and Innovation in the Agri-Food Sector, Sustainable Systems of Agriculture and Rural Viability. Currently, there are over 80 members of research staff and post-graduates students based at Teagasc's Athenry Campus. The successful candidate will work closely with EU-wide partners of the consortium, coordinated by EV ILVO, Belgium.

This is a research focused training role, the primary purpose of which is to provide early career scientists with the opportunity to develop their research skills and competencies.

The PD Fellow will, while working in conjunction with senior research staff, gain insight and experience into a variety of areas including the processes of project and budgetary management, the development of active collaboration with relevant national and international research communities, the development of communication and presentation skills and possible experience in the mentorship of students.

The PD Fellow will conduct a specified programme of research, supported by a modular training programme, which will include modules of relevance for the development of specific knowledge and research skills, professionalism and communication skills, leadership and management skills, and overall career development.

Modules will be conducted under the supervision and direction of Áine Macken-Walsh and Tom O' Dwyer in conjunction with the Head of Department.

**Duties & Responsibilities specific to this project:**

- To develop a theoretical framework to inform empirical work
- To undertake high quality desk-studies and field research
- To analyse data and write-up findings for publication in high ranking academic journals
- To represent Teagasc and be part of an inter-disciplinary and multi-professional team (AgriDemo F2F) and liaise directly with stakeholders and policymakers
- To liaise with Teagasc colleagues to ensure delivery of the requirements of the AgriDemoF2F project
- To present findings in a wide range of fora, including academic conferences and farming events.

**Additional Duties & Responsibilities:**

- To interpret research findings and prepare scientific and popular press publications.
- To disseminate research findings to a variety of audiences as appropriate.

- ❖ Excellent communication skills (oral, written, presentation) with an ability to enable effective knowledge and technology transfer
